Repertoire video round

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart:

First movement from the Concerto for Clarinet (arr. for Viola) and Orchestra in A major, KV 622 (The alternative version in G major is also permitted.)

and

A piece of the competitors' choice for Viola solo or Viola and Piano written and published after 1985.

Maximum length of the videos in total may not exceed the duration of 25 minutes

All selected participants will be informed of their invitation to the live rounds by 28 May 2025 via e-mail.

Repertoire information for the live rounds

The repertoire for the live rounds must be submitted with the confirmation of participation by 11 June 2025 via www.muvac.com.

Repertoire live rounds

1st live round (Quarter-Finals)

The repertoire requirements for the maximum of 24 violists selected for the quarter finals are:

Johann Sebastian Bach:

At least two contrasting movements of

- a Cello Suite BWV 1007-1012 or
- a Violin Sonata or Partita BWV 1001-1006 (transcribed for viola)

and

Paul Hindemith:

At least two contrasting movements of a Sonata for Viola solo

and

A commissioned work of about eight minutes length, composed by **Isabel Mundry** for viola solo. This work will be made available by 1 June 2025.

Maximum duration of 28 minutes

2nd live round (Semi-Finals)

A maximum of eight violists who advance to the Semi-Final Round will play a recital of 60 minutes.

Compulsory Work: Sonata for viola and piano op. 25 No. 4 by Paul Hindemith.

The other self-selected programme should relate to Hindemith in terms of content and be presented with its own moderation (12–15 minutes).

Works with and without piano accompaniment are permitted, works from previous rounds and works with orchestra are not permitted.
